<p><b>Red-back</b> Found all over Australia - mainly in rubbish, under house, dry &amp; sheltered areas</p>	<p><b>White-tail</b> Found in eastern &amp; southern Australia - mainly in gardens, under bark &amp; indoors</p>	<p><b>Funnel-web</b> One of the world's deadliest spiders. Found in eastern Australia, incl. Tasmania and as far west as Gulf Ranges. Male is smaller than female.</p>	<p><b>Common Black House</b> Found mostly in urban southern &amp; eastern Australia - mainly near windows, frames, leaves &amp; fences</p>

<p><b>Garden Wolf</b> Found all over Australia - mainly in burrows on the lawn</p>	<p><b>Mouse</b> Fangs administer deep, painful bite with toxic venom. Found all over Australia - mainly dwelling on ground. Males have red head.</p>	<p><b>Huntsman</b> Rarely bites, but bites can be painful. Found in most parts of Australia - mainly inside &amp; under bark during daytime</p>	<p><b>St Andrew's Cross</b> Found in eastern Australia - mainly in garden</p>
<p><b>Low Risk</b></p> 	<p><b>Low Risk</b></p> 	<p><b>Funnel-web Bite First Aid:</b> Symptoms includes sudden salivation, muscular twitching &amp; breathing difficulty. <b>(1)</b> Check breathing &amp; pulse of patient; <b>(2)</b> Calm &amp; do not move patient; <b>(3)</b> Apply pressure with bandage on bite area; and <b>(4)</b> Call 000 for ambulance.</p> <p><b>White-tail Bite First Aid:</b> Symptoms includes stinging, burning and/or itching sensation at bite spot, small lump, swelling, &amp; discolouration of skin. <b>(1)</b> Apply an ice pack to help relieve swelling; and <b>(2)</b> See your doctor if the skin starts to blister or ulcer.</p> <p><b>Red-back Bite First Aid:</b> Symptoms includes intense spreading pain &amp; hair standing on ends. <b>(1)</b> Apply ice pack to bite area; <b>(2)</b> Calm the patient; and <b>(3)</b> Take patient to nearest hospital.</p>	
<p><b>Garden Orb Weaving</b> Found all over Australia - mainly in garden</p>	<p><b>Trap-door</b> Found all over Australia - mainly dwelling on ground &amp; in burrows. Male has shorter front legs.</p>
